## SUMMARY

Yevtushok V. A. Kushchenko V. A. Legal framework of anti-terrorism in Ukraine: current state and prospects of improvement. The article examines the current state of Ukraine's domestic legislation in the field of countering terrorism. It was emphasized on the relevance of the research topic, which was particularly acute due to the emergence of new challenges and a large number of terrorist organizations and groups.

It is determined that today the legislative basis of the state policy of counteraction to terrorism is a series of normative legal acts. The main legal source is the Constitution of Ukraine.

It is stressed that the necessary condition for counteracting terrorist threats on a national basis is the formation of an effective state policy of counteracting terrorism, which requires the development of a clear concept and strategy, basic principles, conceptual and regulatory principles, and determination of ways of their practical implementation.

The normative and legal basis for counteracting terrorism in Ukraine is analyzed, on the basis of which it is concluded that the system of public administration in the field of security needs to be adequately adjusted, taking into account the need for its synchronization with global approaches to the problem of preventing terrorist threats.

It is concluded that in order to improve the system of counter-terrorism measures, it is necessary to take into account a number of provisions among which: terrorism is a direct attack on the fundamental values of human rights, democracy and the rule of law. The state should act as the initiator of the introduction of scientific stories and foreign experience of counteracting terrorism, use the whole arsenal of available legal means at their disposal for counteracting and stopping terrorist activity. Law enforcement agencies should have a unified strategy and regulatory framework for an effective response to terrorist crimes. Respect for human rights and freedoms is becoming more relevant in crisis situations similar to those of a terrorist nature, and the demands of the state on the issue of ensuring legal guarantees of citizens' rights and freedoms must increase.
